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



- Collaboration among SCHEV, the VCCS, Richard Bland College, fourteen public four-year institutions, many private four-year institutions, and the Aspen Institute College Excellence Program


## TRANSFER VIRGINIA GOALS

- Gateway barriers: Increase the number of students successfully completing math and English in the first year of community college enrollment.
- **Mobility and timeliness**: Improve time to transfer without reducing the number of students who complete an associate degree before transfer.
- **Degree attainment**: Increase the two- and three-year baccalaureate completion rate for transfer students.
- Credit efficiency: Reduce the average number of degree credits earned by transfer students to be comparable to those earned by native students in the same program.



## **GAAs and GPAAs**

(Guaranteed Admission Agreements & Guaranteed Program Admission Agreements)

- For each discipline
- Created by 2-year faculty
- Informed by 4-year schools
- Prepare students for major
  - Include course options
- Designed for use at all 2-yrs

- Created by 4-year schools, unique to each
- Based on common curricula
  - SCT peer review process
    - Student-facing

- Admission to college or program
  - Common template
- Based on common curriculum & transfer guide
