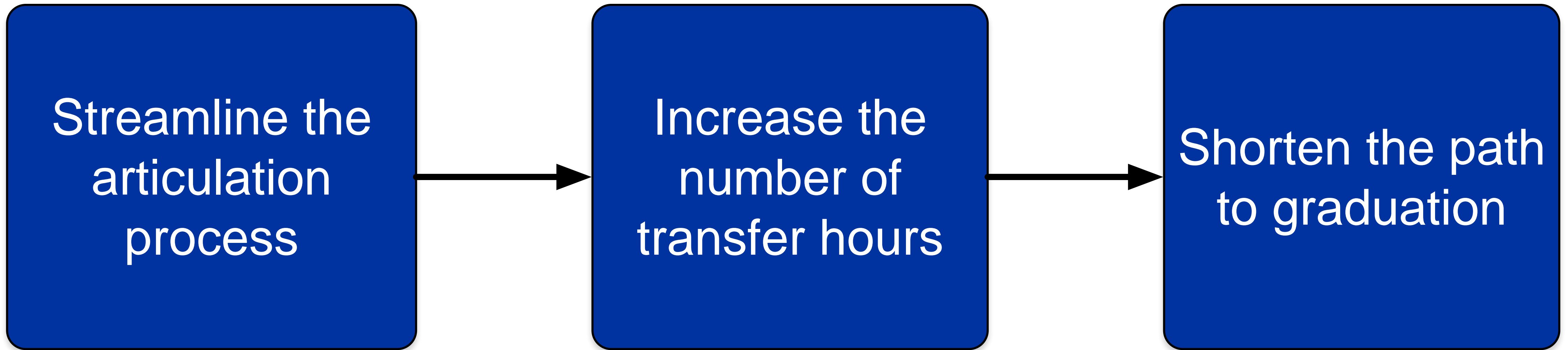



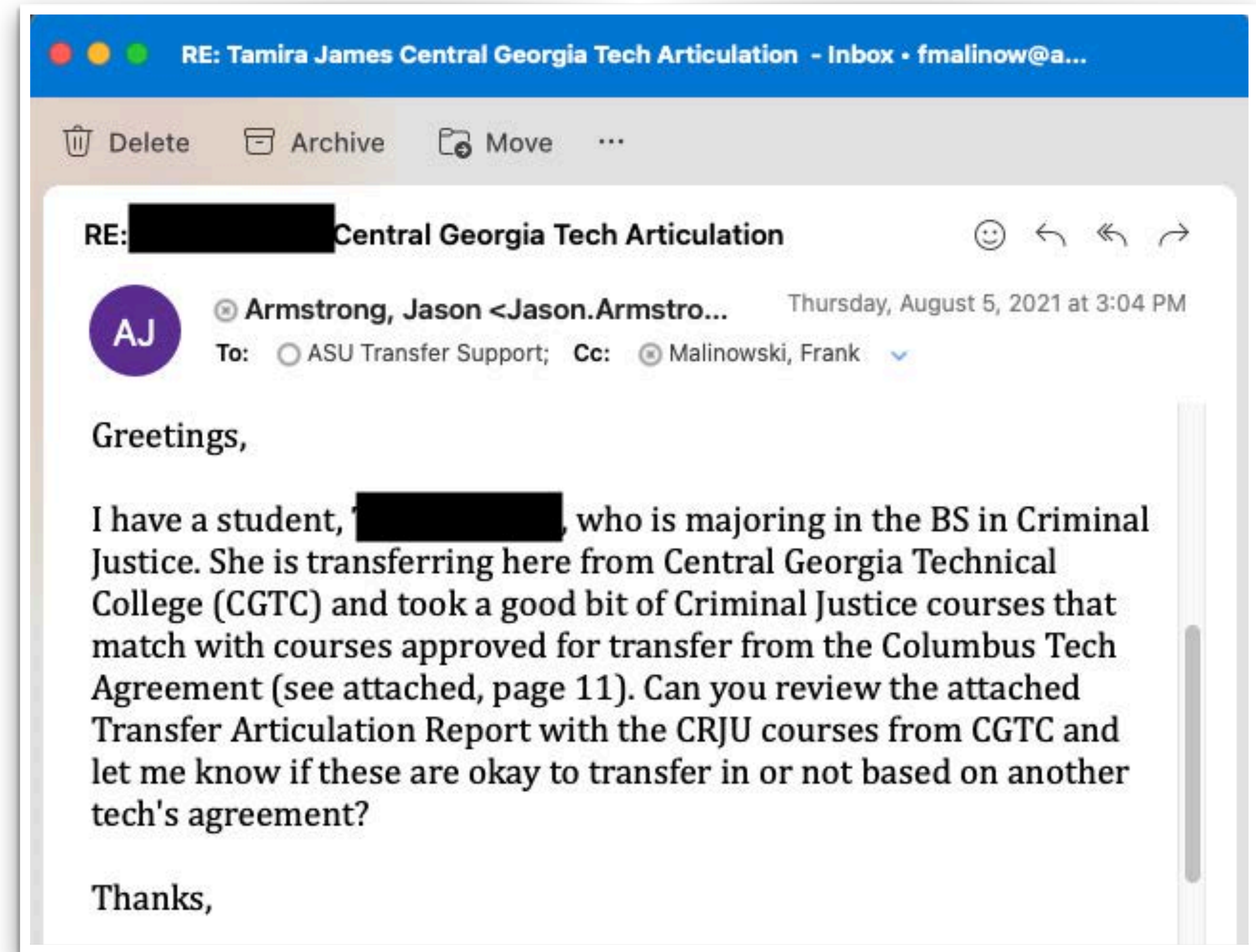
3.3.4 United States and Georgia History and Constitutions
