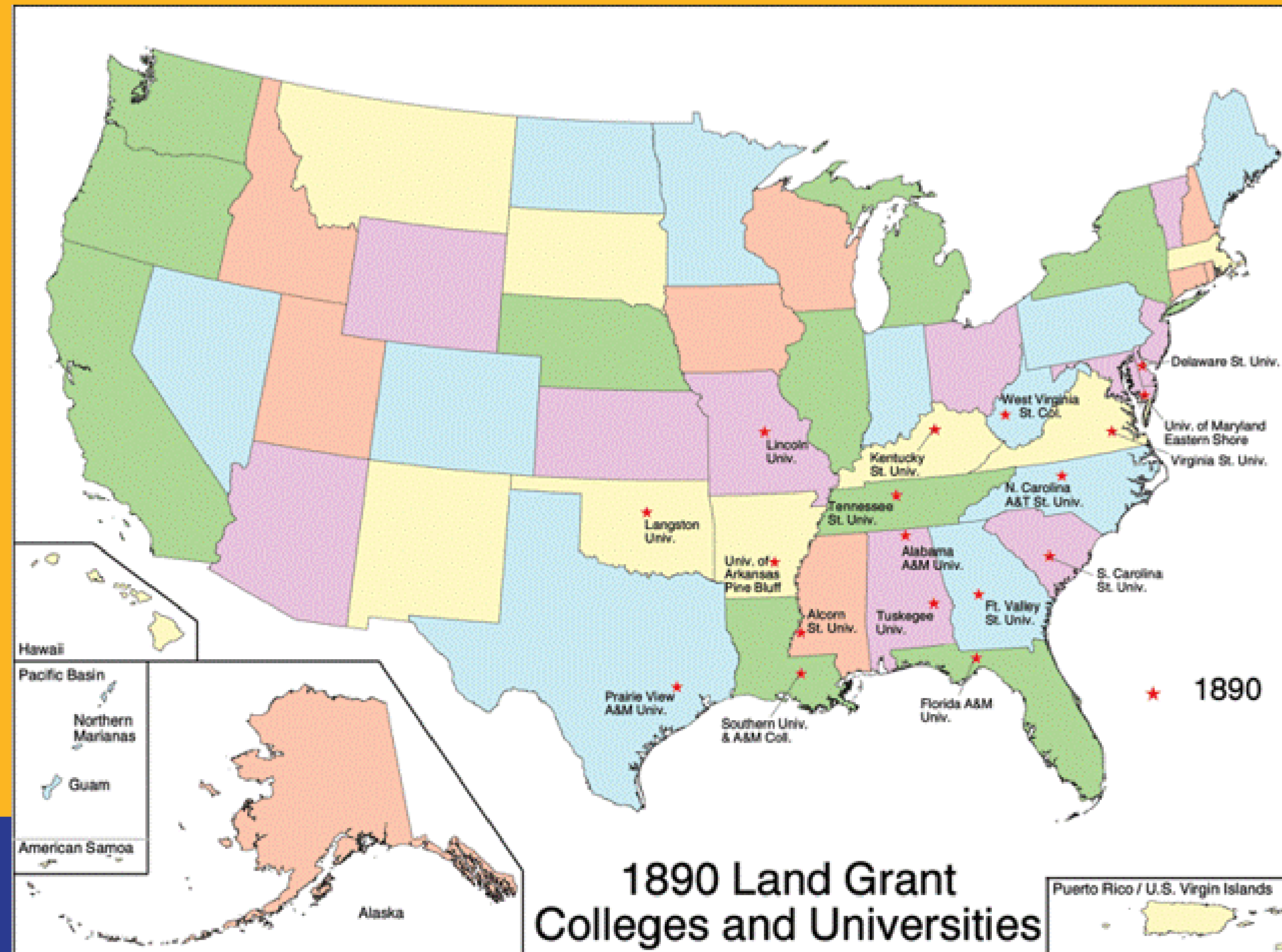

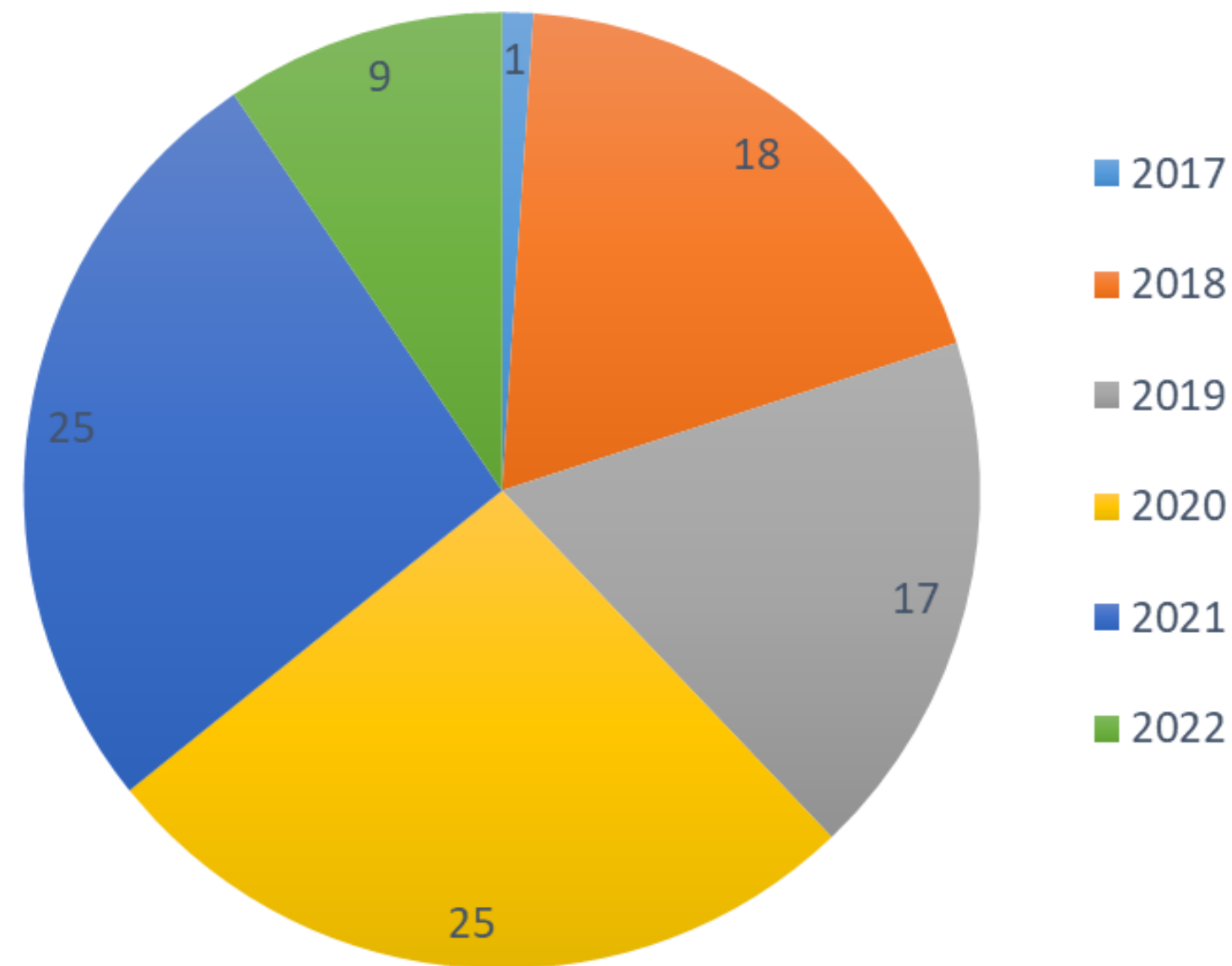


CCCCO Data Mart - Top Transfer HBCU Partner Schools

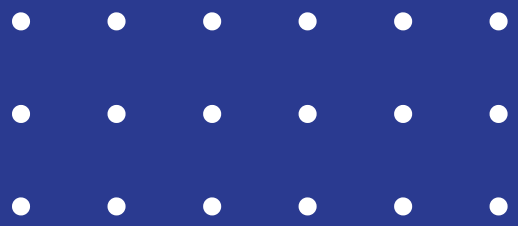
