A group that helps your college or university better serve and welcome its incoming transfer students


Opportunities for transfer students to gain a sense of community at your college or university







































Tau Sigma History



- Beginnings at Auburn University
 - From 1984 to the first chapter in 1999
 - Students in Transition meeting in Pittsburgh
 - Univ at Buffalo, Kent State Univ, Univ of Florida, SUNY Oswego, Univ of Central Florida
 - ■50th chapter (SUNY Albany) in 2008
 - 100th chapter (Governors State) in 2012
 - 200th chapter (TAMU San Antonio) in 2019
 - 100,000th member in 2019
 - \$1,000,000+ in total scholarships awarded 2022






Tau Sigma Scholarships



- **2022 2023**
 - \$100,000 in scholarships awarded 57 scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$5,000
- Each advisor nominates applicants to represent their chapter
- Scholarship applicants are evaluated by a committee of six advisors
- 751 scholarships awarded for a total of \$1,030,500

- Objectives of the Leadership Conference
 - Allow members/advisors to meet and get to know one another and share ideas
 - Provide members an opportunity to formally present their chapter ideas to other members/advisors
 - Thank and reward members/advisors for faithfully serving their chapters

Tau Sigma Leadership Conferences



- Highly subsidized by National
 - \$50/member and \$100/advisor (includes hotel room for two nights, three nice meals at the hotel, t-shirt, activity)
 - Member and advisor must pay for transportation, incidentals, and other meals
- Nice hotels (Marriott, Hilton, Hard Rock, etc.)
- 900+ attendees (250+ advisors, 650+ members)

Tau Sigma Membership



- Membership criteria
 - Student must transfer in with at least one year's worth of academic credits
 - Student must be a full-time student
 - Student must achieve either a 3.5 GPA or be in the top 20% of all incoming transfers during the term in which they complete one full term

Tau Sigma Membership



 Dues are ordinarily between \$50 - \$65, depending on the amount of local dues

Dues waivers exist for students with financial need

 Lifetime membership - students cannot lose their membership, even if their GPA drops below a 3.5

Tau Sigma Membership Process



Universities typically need approximately 300 incoming transfers each year

 Once the PCI form has been approved, the advisor obtains the contact information of those students who meet the eligibility criteria




















Once the deadline passes, the membership is processed, and a chapter is formed!
