How can we create a culture of care and belonging for transfer students on campus?





#### **Pre/post participant survey:**

- Teeling valued
- Feeling of belonging
- Feeling proud of what they had accomplished at UCSD
- Feelings of belief in one's self through hard times
- The Spending more time in self-reflection
- Connection to at least one new faculty or staff member on campus


We currently run Storytellers on a \$3,500 budget.
